- to represent, at the request of the conference of rectors recognized by CRASP, the common public interests of academic and professional universities;
- to take care of the observance of ethical principles, academic values and the ethos of an academic teacher.

As a member of CRASP, a regional university, like ours, may contribute to the development of the higher education system in Poland. Our vote counts.

By focusing on specific problems CRASP committees see the need for environmental changes.

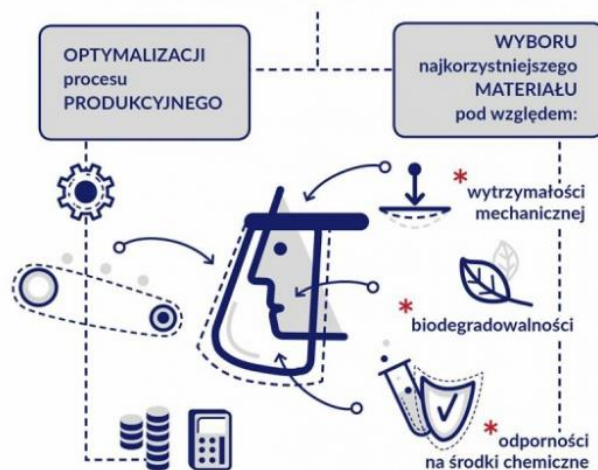
CRASP provides a forum for discussion and disagreement, albeit based on respect and mutual trust.
